TECH MAHINDRA'S ARRIVAL TAKES TECHNOPARK TO A BIGGER LEAGUE



Close on the heels of Nissan Motor Corporation setting up a digital hub at Technocity in Pallipuram, Tech Mahindra, part of the Mahindra Group, is all ready to open a 200-seater facility at a 12,000-square feet area in Technopark. The office space will be on the 10th floor at Ganga Tower, Technopark Phase 3. Hrishikesh Nair, CEO, Kerala IT Parks handed over a letter in this regard to Palani Velu, General Manager (Infrastructure - Corporate Services), Tech Mahindra recently.

In March 2018, C P Guruswami, CEO, Tech Mahindra met Paul Antony IAS, Chief Secretary, Kerala and M Sivasankar IAS, IT Secretary to



discuss plans regarding finding space for the company in Technopark.

“Kerala is getting noticed by IT companies globally as one of the most preferred locations in India. This is because of the extensive support by the state government and extremely skilled talent base the State has to offer,” said Hrishikesh Nair, pointing out how the recent big ticket investments are boosting the investors’ confidence in the State’s IT market. With the arrival of Tech Mahindra in Tech-

nopark, the State will be soon hosting five Indian major IT of the country, boosting the momentum of the on-going #movetotrivandrum campaign. Tech Mahindra will also be providing IT services to Nissan digital hub.

The office is expected to be operational in the next three months. The company will also cater to a range of global clientele. “Initially, Tech Mahindra will employ 200 people. In future, they will have around 2,000 job openings after moving to their own campus in the State,” Pinarayi Vijayan, Kerala Chief Minister, said in a Facebook post.

The State Government is already implementing plans to expand the IT space with new facilities. Bengaluru-based Embassy Group and US-based Taurus Investment Holdings recently inked an agreement with the State government. An IT infrastructure which includes a Special Economic Zone (SEZ) will be developed to set up an Embassy Taurus World Technology Centre worth around Rs. 12 billion.

Headquartered at Pune, Tech Mahindra Limited is an Indian multinational provider of information technology, networking technology solutions and Business Process Outsourcing (BPO) to various industry verticals and horizontals. According to official figures the company the net asset of the company is \$4.7 billion.

THREE KERALA STARTUPS BAG NATIONAL-LEVEL INNOVATION FUNDING

Three startups mentored by the Kerala Startup Mission (KSUM) bagged a seed funding of up to Rs 25 lakh each in the India Innovation Growth Programme (IIGP) 2.0 held in New Delhi recently, which will enable them to scale up their operations and accelerate market penetration.

Kerala-based startups Genrobotic Innovations, Irov Technologies and Sastra Robotics were among the 16 winners who will also get an opportunity to undergo an incubation process along with mentoring support.

IIGP 2018 edition was a combined initiative of Department of Science and Technology (DST), Government of India, Lockheed Martin and Tata Trusts.

The programme aims to support the Government of India's missions of 'Start-up India' and 'Make in India.' It envisages providing an ecosystem to

enable innovators and entrepreneurs to develop technology-based solutions.



The 16 winners were selected from the top 50 innovators chosen from the 3,000 applicants. The selected innovators were given an opportunity to attend a boot camp conducted by IIM-Ahmedabad, after which the 16 were picked. Of the nine startups from Kerala that participated in the event, seven were supported by KSUM.

Genrobotic Innovations Pvt. Ltd., which provides robotic solutions for

sewer cleaning and other manual works, was founded by Arun George, Nikhil N P, Rashid Bin Abdulla and Vimal Govind M K in 2015.

Irov Technologies Pvt. Ltd. uses its underwater drone EyeROV to inspect critical underwater infrastructure.

Kochi-based Sastra Robotics India Pvt. Ltd. is a startup founded by Aronin P in 2012. Its product SR-Dimenzio helps perform human-arm actions for high-risk tasks requiring precision.

These startups will now get an opportunity to test their products in the market with the help of leading scientists, technology experts, entrepreneurs and investors partnered with the programme.

KSUM is the nodal agency of Government of Kerala for entrepreneurship development and incubation activities in the State.
